HIV Around the World ⁽¹⁾

- HIV continues to be a major global public health issue, having claimed more than 35 million lives since the first case in 1981
- In 2016, there were over 1 million HIV related deaths worldwide with 864 HIV related deaths in Florida
- In 2016, 19.5 million people living with HIV were receiving ART globally

Treatment in Florida
Following the advent of highly active anti-retroviral therapy (HAART), there has been an 80% decline in HIV deaths from 1995 to 2015.

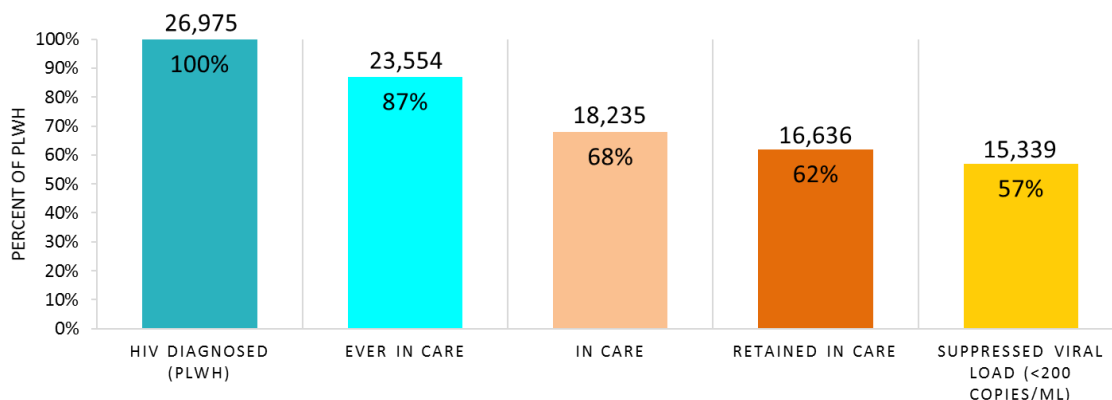

The HIV Care Continuum reflects stages of HIV medical care that begin with an initial diagnosis and aim to achieve a very low level of HIV in the body (viral suppression). A person living with HIV (PLWH) with a suppressed viral load has a less than 1% chance of transmitting the virus.
