



# HIV/AIDS AMONG HISPANICS IN FLORIDA AND MIAMI-DADE

## 2004

### FLORIDA

■ Hispanics comprise 17% of Florida's adult (13+) population, but 16% of the 95,358 AIDS cases and 17% of the 33,159 HIV (not AIDS) cases reported through December 2004.

■ In 2004, Hispanics accounted for 20% of AIDS cases in men and 12% of those in women.

■ In 2004, Hispanics accounted for 22% of HIV (regardless of AIDS status) cases in men and 14% of those in women.

■ In 2004, the reported AIDS cases rate and HIV (regardless of AIDS status) cases rate among Hispanics men were 89.0 and 73.5 per 100, 000 population, respectively. Both rates were more than twice the rate among white males.

■ In 2004, cases rate of HIV (regardless of AIDS status) for adult Hispanic female was 24 and 19 for AIDS. Hispanics women were more than 3 times as likely as white women to be reported with HIV.

■ Between 2000 and 2003, the percentage of adult AIDS cases slightly increased each year, starting with 14% in 2000 and ending with 18% in 2003. However, for the first time since 2000, there was a 1% decrease between 2003 and 2004 in Hispanics AIDS cases.

■ "Men who have sex with men" was the leading mode of exposure with 51% of cases through 2004. Heterosexual contact is 2<sup>nd</sup> accounting for 17% of cases.

■ Cumulatively, 180 (9%) of Florida's 1,944 pediatric HIV/AIDS cases are Hispanic.

### MIAMI-DADE

■ Hispanics comprise 57.3% Miami-Dade population, but 32.7% of the 27,967 AIDS cases and 33.4% of the 10,025 HIV (not AIDS) cases reported through December 2004.

■ In 2004, Hispanics accounted for 38.1% of AIDS cases in men and 16.3% of those in women.

■ In 2004, Hispanics accounted for 39.8% of HIV (regardless of AIDS status) cases in men and 19.8% of those in women.

■ In 2004, the reported AIDS cases rate and HIV (regardless of AIDS status) cases rate among Hispanics men were 54.3 and 76.4 per 100, 000 population, respectively. Both rates were less than the rate among white males.

■ In 2004, cases rate of HIV (regardless of AIDS status) for adult Hispanic female was 11.7 and 16 for AIDS. Hispanics women were almost twice the rate among white females.

■ Between 2000 and 2003, the percentage of adult AIDS cases slightly decreased each year, starting with 4.4% in 2000 and ending with 3.8% in 2003. However, since 2000, there was a slightly increase in Hispanics AIDS cases starting with 3.8% in 2000 and ending with 4.2% in 2003.

■ "Men who have sex with men" was the leading mode of exposure with 61.2% of cases through 2004. Heterosexual contact is 2<sup>nd</sup> accounting for 15% of cases.

■ Cumulatively, 64 (10.3%) of Miami-Dade county's 617 pediatric HIV/AIDS cases are Hispanic.
