

## **HIV/AIDS AMONG HISPANICS**





## In FLORIDA

- Hispanics comprise 20% of Florida's adult (13+) population, but 18% of the 4,944 adult AIDS cases and 19% of the 7,498 HIV (not AIDS) cases reported in 2008.
- In 2008, Hispanics accounted for 20% of AIDS cases in men and 13% of those in women. Hispanic al also accounted for 21% of HIV cases in men and 15% of those in women.
- In 2008, the reported AIDS cases rate and HIV (regardless of AIDS status) cases rate among Hispanics men were 43.4 and 72.8 per 100,000 population, respectively. Both rates were more than twice the rate among white males
- In 2008, the reported AIDS cases rate and HIV (regardless of AIDS status) cases rate among Hispanics women were 12.0 and 17.8 per 100,000 population, respectively. Hispanic women were nearly three times as likely as white women to be reported with HIV
- HIV cases diagnosed among Hispanics between 1999 and 2008 increased by 76%. New HIV cases among Hispanic males increased by 43%; however new HIV cases among Hispanic females decreased by 39%.
- Cumulatively through 2008, 250 (11%) of Florida's 2,254 pediatric HIV/AIDS cases were Hispanic.
- Among living Hispanic male HIV/AIDS cases reported through 2008, men who have sex with men was the leading mode of exposure with 70% of cases; followed by 14% with heterosexual contact and 10% IDU.
- 83% of all living Hispanic females HIV/AIDS cases reported through 2008 were infected through heterosexual contact, 14% were attributed IDU.

## In MIAMI-DADE

- Hispanics comprise 62% of Miami-Dade population, but 33% of the 32,141 AIDS cases and 37% of the 12,297 HIV (not AIDS) cases reported through December 2008.
- In 2008, Hispanics accounted for 42% of AIDS cases in men and 19% of those in women.
- In 2008, Hispanics accounted for 47% of HIV (regardless of AIDS status) cases in men and 23% of those in women.
- In 2008, the reported AIDS cases rate and HIV (regardless of AIDS status) cases rate among Hispanics men were 44.3 and 72.1 per 100,000 population, respectively. Both rates were lower than the rate among white males.
- In 2008, the rate of HIV (regardless of AIDS status) for adult Hispanic female was 10.6 and 8.1 for AIDS. Hispanics women were slightly lower than white women to be reported with HIV
- HIV cases diagnosed among Hispanics between 2000 and 2008 increase by 13.6%. New HIV cases among Hispanic males increase by 26.8% and among Hispanic females by 2.3%.
- Cumulatively, 51 (10%) of Miami-Dade's pediatric AIDS and 26 (14.7%) pediatric HIV (not AIDS) cases are Hispanic.
- Among living Hispanic male HIV/AIDS cases reported through 2008, men who have sex with men was the leading mode of exposure with 71.4% of cases;10.3% were attributes to heterosexual contact and 4.6% to IDU.
- Among all living Hispanic females HIV/AIDS cases reported through 2008, 76.3% were infected through heterosexual contact, 8.8% were attributed IDU.
