

HIV/AIDS IN MIAMI~DADE COUNTY ~ FACT SHEET ~



- Cumulatively through 2009, 32,328 cases have been reported in Miami-Dade County. Miami-Dade County ranks first in the state in the number of AIDS cases, and fourth in the nation in 2007 according to CDC, among metropolitan statistical areas reporting AIDS cases.
- In 2009, 888 AIDS cases were reported in Miami-Dade County. Of them 38% were among Hispanic, 51% among blacks and 9% among withes.
- Cumulatively through 2009, 511 pediatric AIDS cases have been reported in Miami-Dade County. Miami-Dade County ranks first in the state in the number of pediatric AIDS cases.
- X Males account for 74% of cumulative reported AIDS cases, and females account for 26%. The male-to-female ratio is 2.8:1.
- X Of the cumulative number of AIDS cases, 51% are among Blacks, 14% are among Whites, and 34% are among Hispanics.
- Cumulatively through 2009, 12,295 HIV (not AIDS) cases have been reported, which includes 175 pediatric HIV cases. (Reporting of HIV was implemented on July 1st, 1997)
- In 2009, 1,229 HIV (regardless of AIDS status) cases were reported in Miami-Dade County. Of them 44% were among Hispanic, 43% among blacks and 13% among withes.
- X Males account for 70% of cumulative reported HIV cases, and females account for 30%. The male-to-female ratio is 2.3:1.
- X Of the cumulative number of HIV (not AIDS) cases, 46% are among Blacks, 14% are among Whites, and 39% are among Hispanics.
- In 2009, there were 62,470 HIV tests performed in Miami-Dade County, with 2.3% of the tests being positive. Of those, 49% were performed among blacks, 41% among Hispanics and 7% among white population.
- An estimate 24,889 persons are currently living with HIV infection in Miami-Dade County as of December 31st, 2009.
