## The proportion of newly reported HIV cases among adult Hispanic (age 13+) increased from 17% in 2001 to 22% in 2010.

Florida 2010

In Florida, in 2010, the HIV case rate among Hispanic men was 2 times higher than that for white men in Florida and 4 times higher for adult Hispanic women than that among white women.

Among adults (age 13+) one in 111 Hispanic men and one in 439 Hispanic women were living with HIV/AIDS in 2010, compared to one in 201 white men and 1,121 white women.

Of those 18,727 living HIV/AIDS cases among Hispanic through 2010, 30% were US born, 15% Cuban born, 10% Puerto Rican born, 5% Mexican born, 26% were born elsewhere and the remaining 14% had and unknown country of birth.

## The proportion of newly reported HIV cases among adult Hispanic (age 13+) increased from 36% in 2001 to 44% in 2010.

Miami-Dade 2010

In Florida, in 2010, the HIV case rate among Hispanic men was 4 times higher than that for white men in Florida and 10 times higher for adult Hispanic women than that among white women.

Among adults (age 13+) one in 92 Hispanic men and one in 511 Hispanic women were living with HIV/AIDS in 2010, compared to one in 70 white men and 537 white women.

Of those 9,705 living HIV/AIDS cases among Hispanic through 2010, 24% Cuban born, 19% were US born, 6% Puerto Rican born, 5% Colombian & Honduran born respectfully, 4% Venezuelan born, 20% were born elsewhere and the remaining 17% had and unknown country of birth.

## **Recommendations:**

- Raising awareness about HIV/AIDS among Hispanic;
- > Encourage individuals to be tested for HIV/AIDS;
- > Increase youth involvement in HIV community planning, decision making and HIV prevention programming;
- > Reduce barriers to HIV testing, prevention and care by reducing HIV/AIDS stigma; and
- > Disseminate information on the health benefits of condoms and other risk reduction measures.
