



# WORLD AIDS DAY



- HIV continues to be a major global public health issue, having claimed more than 34 million lives so far. In 2014, 1.2 [1.0–1.5] million people died from HIV-related causes globally.
- There were approximately 36.9 [34.3–41.4] million people living with HIV at the end of 2014 with 2.0 [1.9–2.2] million people becoming newly infected with HIV in 2014 globally.
- There is no cure for HIV infection. However, effective treatment with antiretroviral (ARV) drugs can control the virus so that people with HIV can enjoy healthy and productive lives.
- In 2014, 14.9 million people living with HIV were receiving antiretroviral therapy (ART) globally, of which 13.5 million were receiving ART in low- and middle-income countries. The 14.9 million people on ART represent 40% [37–45%] of people living with HIV globally

- It is estimated that one in 85 adults (>=13) resident in Miami-Dade County was living with HIV infection in 2014, one in 106 white adults, one in 31 blacks adults, one in 134 Hispanics adults and one in 136 among adults from other race/ethnicity.
- Of the 26,042 persons diagnosed and living with HIV In Miami-Dade through 2014, 85% was ever in care, 65% in care in 2014, 62% on ART and 54% suppressed viral load (<200 copies/ml)
- In 2014, there were 94,755 HIV tests performed in Miami-Dade County, with 1.51% (1,433) of the tests being positive (19% increase compared with 2012 (79,548) and 52% increase compared with 2006 (64,470)) Of those tests performed in 2014, 41% were among black population, 45% among Hispanics and 10% among white population, and the remaining 4% among other race/ethnicity or missing race.
