

## Quick Stats for Florida

The statistics that follow provide information about the distribution of disease among adolescents and adults that live in Florida.

### STDs Among Adolescents

In 2009, there were 30,659 cases of syphilis, gonorrhea, and chlamydia reported in Florida for ages 15-19. The 30,659 cases correspond to 2,496.6 cases /100,000 residents. From 2008 to 2009, the total reported cases decreased by 0.16% (49 cases).

2009 Breakdown:


- 24,413 of the cases reported in 2009 were chlamydia (79.6 % of the total)
- 5,961 of the cases reported in 2009 were gonorrhea (19.4 % of the total)
- 285 of the cases reported in 2009 were syphilis (9.4 % of the total)

2005 and 2009 Comparison:

- In 2005, 80% of the chlamydia cases were females. In 2009: 72% were females.
- In both 2005 and 2009, 51% of the gonorrhea cases were females.
- In 2005, 71% of the syphilis cases were males. In 2009, 74% were males.
