**Miami, Fla. —** The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County (DOH-Miami-Dade) is lifting the beach advisory for high bacterial levels at the following location:

Key Biscayne, FL 33149**

Tests completed on Wednesday, July 17, 2024, indicate that the water quality at Crandon Park North shows an acceptable level of *Enterococcus* bacteria established by state guidelines. Test results are available at [FloridaHealth.gov/HealthyBeaches](https://FloridaHealth.gov/HealthyBeaches).
