Miami, Fla. — The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County (DOH-Miami-Dade) has issued a water quality advisory for the following locations:

Crandon Park North
Key Biscayne, FL 33149
and
South Point Drive Beach (AKA South Beach Park)
Miami Beach, FL 33139

Tests completed on Tuesday, September 23, 2025, indicate that the water quality at Crandon Park North and South Point Drive Beach (AKA South Beach Park) do not meet the recreational water quality criteria for *Enterococcus* bacteria recommended by the Florida Department of Health.

DOH-Miami-Dade advises against any water-related activities at these locations due to an increased risk of illness in swimmers. Sampling conducted during regular water quality monitoring showed that the level of bacteria exceeds the level established by state guidelines.

This advisory will continue until bacteria levels are below the accepted health level. Test results are available at FloridaHealth.gov/HealthyBeaches.
