Key Biscayne, FL 33149

and

South Point Drive Beach (AKA South Beach Park)

Miami Beach, FL 33139

Tests completed on Tuesday, September 30, 2025, indicate that the water quality at Crandon Park North and South Point Drive Beach (AKA South Beach Park) shows an acceptable level of *Enterococcus* bacteria established by state guidelines.
