Miami, Fla. — The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County (DOH-Miami-Dade) is lifting the advisory for high bacterial levels for the following locations:

**Crandon Park North
Key Biscayne, FL 33149
and
South Point Drive Beach (AKA South Beach Park)
Miami Beach, FL 33139**

Tests completed on Tuesday, September 30, 2025, indicate that the water quality at Crandon Park North and South Point Drive Beach (AKA South Beach Park) shows an acceptable level of *Enterococcus* bacteria established by state guidelines. Test results are available at FloridaHealth.gov/HealthyBeaches.
